Responding to Incidents with an AED

LEVEL 3 : 5 HOURS TRAINING COURSE

This qualification is aimed those working in an environment where an AED is available and staff members need additional training in its use and maintenance. The qualification has been mapped to current Resuscitation Council (UK) guidelines.

RQF Level 3 Award

Qualification title: QNUK Level 3 Award in Responding to Incidents with an AED (RQF)

This qualification is for those that require additional training in basic life support and safe use of an AED. It has been designed as the perfect add-on to standard first aid courses where learners are typically only required to understand how to attach the AED pads and follow instructions. This qualification builds on that knowledge to provide a wider understanding of using this work equipment as required by workplace regulations.

Duration

Total qualification Time (TQT) is 5 hours, with at least 3 Guided Learning Hours (GLH) in the classroom over a minimum of 5 hours plus independent pre and post course study.

Course Content

- The learner will be able to assess an incident
- The learner will be able to provide first aid to an unresponsive casualty that is not breathing normally
- The learner will be able to provide first aid to an unresponsive casualty that is breathing normally
- The learner will be able to provide first aid to a casualty who is choking
- The learner will understand the principles of using and maintaining an AED
- Maintaining and using an Automated External Defibrillator

Numbers

A maximum of 12 students are allowed and must be a minimum of 16 years of age.

Assessment

The qualification assessment includes a written and practical assessment. You must successfully complete both assessments to achieve the qualification.

Certification

The qualification is valid for one year from the date of achievement. It is recommended that you attend annual refresher training. You will need to complete the full course again to re-qualify for a further one year.
